Tucker will be 3 years old on April 30th. I bought him through a breeder I had been following for quite some time when he was 6 months old.

Initially when getting him home from picking him up at LAX it seemed like he had never been in a home or experienced a lot of interactions connecting with people. I contacted the breeder and was told that during 2020 she didn't have a lot of her regular staff on hand during COVID which explained a lot about his behavior.

We soon got into a routine which calmed him down and made him more comfortable in his new environment. I took him for training which was helpful, but in hindsight I believe it was too much for him at the time.

I spent the first year taking him to the PV dog park each morning to socialize. He is definitely more attached to being/playing with other dogs than his connections with people and didn't ever want to leave .

I also take him and my other dog for 3-4 miles walking trails in our area most every day. He has also done some traveling with me and my other dog camping and did great.

He was the runt of the litter and is more a follower than a leader. He gets along great with other dogs.

The only time I have experienced him turning on his herding instincts was at the dog park with 2 dogs that he initially were good playmates and then if they were too submissive he would try to herd them.

He has not shown this to be the case in any other setting I have had him in.

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
