She listens fairly well, but if there is a lot going on she is in her own world so it can take few times before she will obey, this has been a progressive growth, and I imagine that time and age has a part in it. She eats 2 meals a day, free feeding her is not recommended as she is food driven and if you just give her food any ole time she would probably not be a very good listener at all.

Makia would be great with a stay at home worker, retiree, stay at home mother or father, or even with someone that would like a dog to take work with them. She has also been around elderly and has done really well with them. She will need reminding at times to not jump, she just gets excited upon first seeing someone she loves, but for the most part she has grown out of this, and it's not an issue.

I would love it if she went to someone that would be open letting me visit with her, maybe take her on a little trip from time to time, and send me pictures occasionally as well as her progress acclimating in to your home. I love her so much, but it really is apparent how much she needs stability and a good, loving home to call her own and I am just not capable of giving her that right now.
